STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE

An Act to Provide Interest on Community Agency Accounts.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §1552, sub-§2-A is enacted to read:

2-A. Community agency. "Community agency" means a person, a public or private nonprofit organization or a firm, partnership or business corporation operated for profit that:

A. Operates a human service program at the community level; and

<u>B. Is not an administrative unit of the Federal Government</u> or State Government.

Sec. 2. 5 MRSA §1554, as enacted by PL 1983, c. 655, is amended to read:

18 §1554. Payment of late fees

In the event that a proper invoice is not paid within 25 working days after receipt of the invoice, or within 15 days following another date agreed to by the state agency and the business concern, the state agency shall-be is liable to pay a reasonable late fee that shall may not exceed the normal late charge that the business concern levies on the amount due on the invoice.

In the event that federal meneys-are money is the budgeted source of funds for payment to business concerns for state agency purchases of goods, property or services, and these meneys-are this money is unexpectedly withheld and delayed from reaching the State in time to pay proper invoices without incurring a late fee, the state agency which that made the purchases and the State of-Maine-shall are not be liable for any late fees on overdue payments.

When a proper invoice of a community agency is not paid38within 90 days after receipt of the invoice, the state agency isliable to pay a standard late fee of interest at the rate of 15%40per annum from that date.
