An Act to Allow the Creation of County Budget Committees by Referendum Vote.

	1. Membership. The budget committee consists of 9
40	members: two elected members and one appointed from each county
42	commissioner district selected as provided for in this section. The county commissioners serve on the committee in an advisory
42	capacity only and may not vote on any committee matters.

- -	Starting in 1993, at least 90 days before the end of every fiscal
46	year, the municipal officers from each county commissioner

district shall choose the elected members by the following procedure.

A. The county commissioners shall direct all municipal officers in the county to caucus by county commissioner districts at a specified date, time and place for the purpose of nominating at least one municipal officer from each district as a candidate for the county budget committee, except that in the first election under this section at least 2 municipal officers must be nominated from each district. The county commissioner of the district shall serve as nonvoting moderator for that district caucus. Nominations must be received from the floor. A municipal officer may vote for more than one nominee to be placed on the written ballot for that district. The nominee receiving the most votes is approved for placement on the ballot. Any other nominee who receives a majority vote of those present is also approved for placement on the ballot. The names of those duly approved must be recorded and forwarded to the county commissioners to be placed on a written ballot.

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The county commissioners shall have written ballots printed with the names of those candidates selected in their district under paragraph A. Each commissioner district requires a separate ballot and each ballot must specify each candidate's full name and municipality. The county commissioners shall distribute the appropriate ballots to each municipality within a commissioner district. The municipal officers of each municipality shall vote as a board for one budget committee member from the candidates on the ballot and return the ballot to the county commissioners by a certain date, except that in the first election under this section, the municipal officers of each municipality shall vote as a board for 2 budget committee members. The ballot must be counted at a regular meeting of the county commissioners. Each vote must be weighted according to that municipality's population as a proportion of the district's total population. The county commissioners shall select the nominee receiving the most votes, as weighted, except that in the first election under this section, the county commissioners shall select the 2 nominees receiving the most votes as weighted. For the purposes of this section, "population" means the number of people as determined by the latest federal Decennial Census or the number of people as determined and certified by the Department of Human Services, whichever is more recent. The county commissioners shall notify each municipality, in writing, of the results of the election and certify the results to the Secretary of State.

52 Each county commissioner shall appoint one member of the general public to serve on the budget committee from that commissioner's district.

- 2. Duties. The county budget committee shall review the 2 budget estimates prepared by the county commissioners and approve 4 a final county budget.
 - 3. Term of office. The term of office for the elected members is 2 years beginning on October 1st, provided that a budget committee member remains a municipal officer in that officer's municipality, except that of those elected in 1993, one from each district is elected for a term of one year and one from each district is elected for a term of 2 years. The term of office for the appointed members is 2 years beginning on October 1st in odd-numbered years, provided that a budget committee member remains a resident of the county commissioner district. Those appointed in 1993 are appointed for a term of one year.

4. Vacancies. The budget committee shall fill a vacancy 18 occurring in an elected position on the committee for the balance of the unexpired term. The person appointed by the budget 20 committee to fill the vacant office must be a municipal officer from the same municipality as the person vacating the office. A 22 vacancy in a position representing the general public must be filled by appointment by the commissioner for that district for 24 the balance of the unexpired term. The person appointed to fill this vacancy must be a resident of the appointing commissioner's 26 district.

- 5. Expenses. Members serve without compensation, but are entitled to reimbursement from the county treasury for expenses incurred in performing their duties.
- §713. Budget committee organization

The budget committee shall conduct its meetings in public at 34 the county courthouse or any other convenient public building. 36 The county commissioners shall call an organizational meeting of the budget committee no later than 60 days before the end of the 38 county's fiscal year. The county commissioners shall provide the committee with necessary clerical assistance, office expenses and 40 suitable meeting space, as well as access to county files and information. The budget committee shall adopt its own rules, 42 procedures and bylaws.

§714. Budget process

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- 1. Proposed budget. The county commissioners shall submit an itemized budget estimate, as described in section 701, to the 48 budget committee in a timely fashion, no later than 60 days before the end of the county's fiscal year.
- 2. Budget review process. The budget committee shall 52 review the proposed itemized budget prepared by the county

commissioners, together with any supplementary material prepared 2 by the head of each county department or provided by any independent board or institution or another governmental agency. The budget committee may increase, decrease or revise the proposed budget, provided that: б A. The budget committee shall enter into its minutes an explanation for any change in the estimated expenditures and 8 revenues as initially presented by the county commissioners; 10 12 B. The total estimated revenues, together with the amount of county tax to be levied, must equal the total estimated expenditures. 14 3. Public hearing. The budget committee shall hold a 16 public hearing in the county on the proposed budget before the end of the county's fiscal year and before the final adoption of 18 the budget. At least 10 days before the hearing, the budget 20 committee shall publish a notice in a newspaper of general circulation within the county. Written notice and a copy of the proposed budget must be sent by registered or certified mail with 22 return receipt requested, or delivered in person with proof received of the delivery, to the clerk of each municipality in 24 the county. The municipal clerk shall notify the municipal officers of the proposed budget. 26 4. Adoption of budget. After the public hearing is 28 completed, the budget committee may further increase, decrease, 30 and revise the proposed itemized budget, subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed in subsection 2. The proposed itemized budget must be finally adopted by a majority 32 vote of the full membership of the budget committee at a meeting not later than the end of the county's fiscal year. The approved 34 budget is the final authorization for the assessment of county taxes. The budget must be sent to the county commissioners and 36 the county tax authorized must be apportioned and collected in accordance with section 706. 38 5. Interim budget. If the budget is not approved before 40 the start of a fiscal year, until a budget is finally adopted the county shall operate on an interim budget that may not exceed 90% 42 of the previous year's budget. 44 \$715. Budget amendments 46 The approved budget governs the expenditures of the county 48 during the fiscal year. Expenses may not be incurred in excess

36	This bill replaces the previous statutory method of approving county budgets by transferring authority from the
30	legislative delegation and the Legislature to a committee
38	comprised of county citizens and municipal officials. This bill

provides for a county budget process in which each county sets its own budget through a budget committee composed of municipal

officers and members of the general public. It is modeled on the

Waldo County budget process, which has worked well according to municipal officials, county officials and citizens in that county. The bill goes into effect only in those counties that

approve it in a countywide referendum held in conjunction with a regular election. The 13 counties in the State that do not have

a budget committee with budget-setting authority may hold a referendum on November 6, 1992 to see whether the voters approve

the creation of such a committee.

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
