COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1056, L.D. 1545, Bill, "An Act to Provide Training for Long-term Care Facilities Personnel"

Amend the bill in that part designated "~~§2162.~~" in the first paragraph by striking out all of the first sentence (page 1, lines 22 to 24 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following: 'The Department of Labor and the Department of Education shall jointly administer this chapter.'

Further amend the bill in that part designated "~~§2164.~~" by striking out all of subsection 3 (page 2, lines 4 to 11 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following:

'3. Certification. Participants who complete training under this section with a curriculum approved by the Department of Education to include both theoretical and practical training receive a statewide certificate granted by the Department of Education. This certificate or a certificate issued under subsection 4 is required for employment as an activities coordinator in this State after December 31, 1993, except that a person employed as an activities coordinator on the effective date of this chapter who has completed a training program approved by the Department of Human Services is not required to obtain a certificate under this section.'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

**FISCAL NOTE**

This bill establishes a training program for personnel who work in long-term care facilities. Educational costs incurred by long-term care facilities are presently allowable costs and under the prospective reimbursement system there would be no increase in this allowance and no increased costs to the Department of Human Services.
