HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1057,, L.D. 1546, Bill, "An Act to Amend the Unfair Trade Practices Act to Allow Consumers to Recover Damages"

Amend the bill by inserting after section 2 the following:

'Sec. 3. Application. The Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 213, subsection 1-A applies only to actions for damages filed after the effective date of this Act.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

The original bill allows consumers who have been injured by an illegal or unfair trade practice to seek reimbursement for damages. This amendment indicates that this right is only available for those actions that are filed after the effective date of this Act.
