30	§2231. Definitions

34	As used in this subchapter, unless the context otherwise indicates, the following terms have the following meanings.
36	1. Incineration facility. "Incineration facility" means a
38	facility that accepts municipal solid waste for consideration and disposes of the waste through combustion, including combustion
	for the generation of heat, steam or electricity. A facility
10	that incinerates municipal solid waste in amounts that constitute less than 2% by weight of its fuel is not an incineration
12	facility.
4	2. Solid waste. "Solid waste" means useless, unwanted or
	discarded solid material with insufficient liquid content to be
<u>.</u> 6	free flowing, including, but not limited to, rubbish, garbage, scrap materials, junk, refuse, inert fill material and landscape
8	refuse. "Solid waste" includes fuel, whether solid, liquid or
	gas, derived from materials such as those listed.

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2	<ol><li>Tipping fee. "Tipping fee" means any fee, rate, toll or</li></ol>
	other charge that an incineration facility charges for disposal
4	of solid waste from the facility's customers.
б	4. Waste source. "Waste source" means any entity that pays
	a tipping fee to an incineration facility.
8	\$2232. Reporting
10	An incineration facility shall submit an annual report to
12	the agency no later than 60 days after the end of the
	incineration facility's fiscal year. For reasonable cause shown
14	and upon written application by an incineration facility, the
	agency may grant an extension of the 60-day period. The report
16	must be certified by an appropriate executive officer of the
	incineration facility as being complete and accurate. The agency
18	may prescribe the form of the annual report and the number of
	copies that must be submitted. The report must include the
20	following information:
22	1. Waste. The total weight in tons of all solid waste
	received by the incineration facility in the last completed
24	fiscal year and each month of that year and a breakdown of these
	totals according to the waste sources;

	<ol><li>Tipping fee. A schedule of various tipping fees imposed</li></ol>
28	by the incineration facility on the incineration facility's
	customers over the last completed fiscal year including an
30	identification of all changes in those fees and a similar
	schedule of fees to be imposed and projected to be imposed for

34	3. Revenue. The total revenue of the incineration facility

2	§2233. Civil violation
2	A person that violates any requirement of section 223
4	commits a civil violation for which a forfeiture not to excee \$200 may be adjudged. Each day of a violation is considered
6	separate offense.
. 8	§2234. Civil penalty
10	A person that certifies a report under section 2232 as being complete and accurate and who knows that the report is eithe
12	incomplete or inaccurate is subject to a civil penalty not to exceed \$500, payable to the State. This penalty is recoverable
14	in a civil action.
16	§2235. Use of files
18	The agency shall keep on file for public inspection and use all reports submitted under this subchapter.
20	§2236. Limitation
22	
24	Nothing in the subchapter may be construed to create or expand any agency authority over financial, organizational or rate regulation of incineration facilities.

28	FISCAL NOTE
30	The costs associated with the design, distribution and monitoring of annual reports of incineration facilities can be
32	absorbed within existing resources of the Maine Waste Management Agency.
34	The additional workload and administrative costs associated
36	with the minimal number of new cases filed in the court system will be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Judicial
38	Department. There may be a minor increase of General Fund revenue from the collection of fines.'

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## COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "H to H.P. 1059, L.D. 1548

•	1. Scrikes and repraces the bill;
2	2 Paraless indirection facilities to file appeal reports
4	2. Requires incineration facilities to file annual reports with the Maine Waste Management Agency within 60 days of the end of the utility's fiscal year. The Maine Waste Management Agency
6	may grant deadline extensions. These reports must include the following:

10	A. Total annual and monthly weight in tons of solid waste received by the facility and the waste sources;
12	B. The tipping fee schedule of the facility for the last completed fiscal year and the coming fiscal year;
