Resolve, to Create the Task Force on Life-long Learning and Educational Choice.



Sec. 1. Task force established. Resolved: That the Task Force on Life-long Learning and Educational Choice is established; and be it further 4 Sec. 2. Task force membership; chair. Resolved: That the task force consists of the following 13 members: Three members appointed by the President of the Senate, not more than one of whom may be a Legislator and not more than 10 one of whom may be employed by the State; 12 Three members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, not more than one of whom may be a Legislator and not more than one of whom may be employed by the State; 14 Six members appointed by the Governor, not more than one 16 of whom may be a Legislator and not more than one of whom may be employed by the State; and 18 20 One member appointed by the other 12 task force members who shall serve as the chair; and be it further 22 Sec. 3. Appointment; meetings. Resolved: That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date 24 The Executive Director of the Legislative of this resolve. Council must be notified by the Governor, the President of the 2.6 Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives when their selections have been made. The Chair of the Legislative Council 28 shall call the first meeting of the task force, at which time the 30 task force may appoint the 13th and final member; and be it further 32 Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the task force shall undertake 34 a study of teacher training, curriculum development facilities planning, with the primary goals of proposing a comprehensive integration of the various parts of our educational 36 system and proposing means of meeting the need for life-long learning opportunities in the State. As part of the study, the 38 task force shall: 40 1. Update the assessment program bequn in 1984 considering curriculum needs; 42 44 Determine the need for, and benefits of, life-long learning; 46 Consider mechanisms for improving teacher preparedness, especially for working with adult learners; 48

schools to become centers for learning, including the additions

of technological and telecommunications facilities,

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4. Develop a plan that recognizes the need to retool local

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2	spaces and the physical requirements of adult learners, and that provides for year-round use in the planning, adaptation and construction of schools; and
4	5. Propose methods to establish a life-long quidance
6	network throughout the State, improve links between the public educational system and private sector training programs and

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12	In the performance of its duties, the task force may hold public hearings and conferences with any person, persons, organizations or governmental agencies. The task force may be

18	assist the task force in carrying out the purposes of this resolve; and be it further
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22	Sec. 5. Report. Resolved: That the task force shall submit its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the 115th Legislature no later

26	Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the University of Maine
28.	System shall staff the task force to conduct research and prepare reports for the task force; and be it further
30	Sec. 7. Reimbursement. Resolved: That the members of the task force who are Legislators are entitled to the legislative
32	per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, for days of attendance at task force meetings. All
34	members of the task force who are not state employees are entitled to expenses, as defined in Title 5, section 12002, upon
36	application to the Executive Director of the Legislative Council for those expenses; and be it further
