## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE

Resolve, to Create the Commission to Evaluate the Need for Changes in the Responsibilities of State, County and Local Government for the 21st Century. Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission to Evaluate the Need for Changes in the Responsibilities of State, County and Local Government for the 21st Century is established; and be it further

Sec. 2. Commission membership; chair. Resolved: That the commission consists of the following 13 members:

1. Three members appointed by the President of the Senate, not more than one of whom may be a Legislator and not more than one of whom may be employed by the State;

2. Three members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, not more than one of whom may be a Legislator and not more than one of whom may be employed by the State;

3. Six members appointed by the Governor, not more than one of whom may be a Legislator and not more than one of whom may be employed by the State; and

4. One member appointed by the other 12 commission members who shall serve as the chair; and be it further

Appointments; Sec. 3. meetings. **Resolved:** That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council must be notified by the Governor, the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives when their selections have been made. The Chair of the Legislative Council shall call the first meeting of the commission, at which time the commission may appoint the 13th and final commission member; and be it further

34 Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall undertake a study of the State's rules of local, regional and county 36 government and State Government, with a primary goal of proposing changes that will more closely fit the needs of the 21st 38 century. As part of the study, the commission shall:

40 1. Review recent studies and analyses of the status of State Government and local government;

2. Evaluate the current functions and responsibilities of 44 State Government and county and local government in this State;

3. Identify which of the current functions of each level of government are outmoded or ineffectively carried out and which
should be expanded or reassigned to other levels;

Recommend mechanisms for facilitating town decision making and ways to ensure stable funding and accountability;

5. Review the possible use of new regional boundaries for the political subdivisions delivering services; and

6. In the performance of its duties, the commission may hold public hearings and conferences with any person, persons, organizations or governmental agencies. Any agency, department, legislative committee or other instrumentality of the State, with the consent of the head of the respective organization, shall provide the commission with information, reports or other assistance. State agencies shall, upon request, assist the commission in carrying out the purposes of this resolve; and be it further

Sec. 5. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall submit its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the 115th Legislature no later than November 1, 1992; and be it further

Sec. 6. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the commission may contract with a research assistant to provide professional services as primary staff. The chair of the commission shall manage the research assistant's work. The research assistant shall provide clerical assistance and prepare any legislation recommended by the commission; and be it further

Sec. 7. Reimbursement. Resolved: That the members of the commission who are Legislators are entitled to the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, for days of attendance at commission meetings. All members of the commission who are not state employees are entitled to expenses, as defined in Title 5, section 12002, upon application to the Executive Director of the Legislative Council for those expenses; and be it further

Sec. 8. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this resolve.
