STATEMENT OF FACT

Service contracts are extended repair agreements that are sold separately from a consumer product and provide the consumer purchaser with protection against breakdowns that are not covered by the product's regular express warranty. Service contracts are often administered or guaranteed by companies separate from the sellers of the consumer goods. In the past, Maine consumers have purchased separate service contracts only to later find out that the service contract company has gone out of business. This bill provides that the seller of the consumer product must make any repairs or service calls covered by the service contract if the company administering the service contract goes out of business.
