COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1073, L.D. 1567, Bill, "An Act to Provide Identification Cards for Persons 18 to 20 Years of Age"

Amend the bill in section 2 in subsection 2 in the 2nd line (page 1, line 23 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "\$2," and inserting in its place the following: '\$2, \$5.'

Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the statement of fact the following:

This bill will provide nondriver identification cards to persons between 18 and 21 years of age and require Highway Fund allocations to the Division of Motor Vehicles of \$36,665 in fiscal year 1991-92 and \$33,361 in fiscal year 1992-93. This allocation will provide funds for a service representative and costs associated with the production of identification cards. The \$5 fee for the cards will increase Highway Fund revenue by \$56,023 in fiscal year 1991-92 and \$18,673 in fiscal year 1992-93 based on a 50% participation rate of an estimated 22,409 eligible individuals.'
