An Act to Provide Identification Cards for Persons 18 to 20 Years of Age.



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

3 **Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §88-A, sub-§1**, as amended by PL 1987, c. 342,
4 §1, is further amended to read:

6 **1. Application.** Any person ~~21~~ 18 years of age or over may
7 apply for an official state nondriver identification card. The
8 application must be on a form provided by the Secretary of State
9 and include any supporting documents and information required by
10 the Secretary of State.

12 A. The application form must include, directly above the
13 signature line, the following notice to the applicant: "I
14 understand that knowingly supplying false information on
15 this form is a Class D crime under Title 17-A, punishable by
16 confinement of up to 364 days or by monetary fine of up to
17 \$1,000, or both."

18 **Sec. 2. 5 MRSA §88-A, sub-§§2 and 3**, as enacted by PL 1987, c.
19 45, Pt. A, §1, are amended to read:

22 **2. Issuance of card; contents.** Upon receipt of a completed
23 application and payment of a fee of \$2, the Secretary of State
24 shall issue an identification card to the applicant. The
25 Secretary of State shall design cards for persons 18 to 21 years
26 of age so that they are readily distinguishable from cards for
27 persons 21 years of age or older. The Each card must contain:

- 28 A. The applicant's photograph;
29 B. The applicant's name and address;
30 C. The applicant's date of birth; and
31 D. Any other information and identification ~~which~~ that the
32 Secretary of State considers necessary.

33 **3. Validity.** The An identification card issued under this
34 section is not valid until signed by the applicant.

STATEMENT OF FACT

35 This bill makes nondriver identification cards, issued by
36 the Secretary of State, available to persons between 18 and 21
37 years of age. These cards must be designed so that they are
38 readily distinguishable from nondriver identification cards
39 issued to persons who are 21 years of age and older.
