**An Act to Require Minimum Training Standards for Construction
Flaggers.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

23 MRSA §707 is enacted to read:

§707. Construction flaggers; minimum training standards

All flaggers at highway construction sites, public or private, must have a minimum of 2 hours of training in directing traffic at construction sites. The Department of Transportation shall develop minimum standards for construction flaggers and shall administer a training program for construction flaggers.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill requires that construction flaggers have a minimum of 2 hours of training in directing traffic at construction sites. The bill also requires the Department of Transportation to develop and administer the training program.
