IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE

An Act to Increase the Annual Public Utilities Commission Regulatory Fund Assessment and Make Certain Other Changes.

(EMERGENCY)

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Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the next fiscal year may begin before the expiration of the 90-day period; and

Whereas, the Public Utilities Commission requires additional funds in fiscal years 1991-92 and 1992-93 for ongoing services to ensure reliable service at just and reasonable rates for state ratepayers; and

Whereas, these funds must be assessed by May 1, 1991 to be available in fiscal year 1991-92; and 14

16 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

22 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 35-A MRSA §116, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1991, c. 9, Pt. E, §19, is further amended to read:

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1. Utilities subject to assessments. Every electric, gas, telegraph, telephone and water utility and ferry subject to regulation by the commission is subject to an assessment of not more than .35% on its intrastate gross operating revenues to produce no more than \$3,378,000 \$4,475,000 in revenues annually 32 beginning in the 1990-91 1991-92 fiscal year and not more than \$4,918,000 in revenues annually beginning in the 1992-93 fiscal year. The commission shall determine the assessments annually 34 prior to May 1st and assess each utility for its pro rata share for expenditure during the fiscal year beginning July 1st. Each 36 utility shall pay the assessment charged to the utility on or before July 1st of each year. Any increase in the assessment 38 that becomes effective subsequent to May 1st may be billed on the 40 effective date of the act authorizing the increase.

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Α. The assessments charged to utilities under this section are just and reasonable operating costs for rate-making purposes.

In view of the emergency cited in the 40 preamble, this Act takes effect when approved. 42 44 STATEMENT OF FACT 46 This bill increases the annual Public Utilities Commission 48 Regulatory Fund assessment by \$1,097,000 to a total of \$4,475,000 beginning in fiscal year 1991-92 and by an additional \$443,000 to 50 a total of \$4,918,000 beginning in fiscal year 1992-93. Together

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with the existing level of Public Utilities Commission Regulatory

Fund assessments, these increases will provide the Public 2...... Utilities Commission with sufficient funds to carry out its duties. The additional funds will be used to fund increases in personnel costs and general operating expenses and to fund 22 positions previously transferred from the General Fund. The bill б also adds language to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 35-A, section 116, subsection 1 suggested by the State Auditor and deletes subsection 7 relating to the renovation of commission 8 offices that is now complete.

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
