COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1105, L.D. 1604, "Resolve, to Create a Commission to Study the Need for a Technical College in York County"

Amend the resolve by striking out all of section 2 and inserting in its place the following:

Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of the following 8 members:

1. The President of the Maine Technical College System or the president's designee;

2. The Director of the Sanford Regional Vocational Center or the director's designee;

3. One member of the Senate and one member of the House of Representatives, appointed by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives respectively; and

4. Four members appointed by the Governor as follows:

A. Two members of the general public from York County, one of whom is from industry; and

B. Two people who engage in trade professionally, one from nominations submitted by the Maine Tradeswomen's Network and one from nominations submitted by the American Federation of Labor - Congress of Industrial Organizations; and be it further'

Further amend the resolve in section 4 by inserting after subsection 3 the following:

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2 '4. Assess the needs of people who have been traditionally
underserved by the Maine Technical College System, including
4 women, minorities and persons with disabilities;'

6 Further amend the resolve in section 4 in subsection 4 in
the first line (page 2, line 9 in L.D.) by striking out the
8 following: "4." and inserting in its place the following: '5.'
and in the last line (page 2, line 11 in L.D.) by inserting at
the end the following: 'and'

10 Further amend the resolve in section 4 in subsection 5 in
12 the first line (page 2, line 13 in L.D.) by striking out the
following: "5." and inserting in its place the following: '6.'

14 Further amend the resolve in section 5 by striking out all
16 of subsections 1 and 2 and inserting in their place the following:

18 '1. Meet at convenient times and places within Augusta or
York County;

20 2. Hold informational sessions and discussions with
22 knowledgeable people;'

24 Further amend the resolve in section 5 by striking out all
of subsection 5.

26 Further amend the resolve in section 5 by renumbering the
28 subsections to read consecutively.

30 Further amend the resolve by striking out all of section 6.

32 Further amend the resolve by striking out all of section 7
and inserting in its place the following:

34 'Sec. 7. Funding. Resolved: That the Legislative Council, on
36 behalf of the Joint Standing Committee on Education, may seek
outside sources of funding to finance the study provided in this
38 resolve. The Legislative Council shall administer any outside
funds acquired for the conduct of the study. Expenditures may
40 not be incurred that have an impact on the General Fund.
Expenditures may not be incurred relative to this study unless
42 funding from outside sources has been received by the Legislative
Council; and be it further'

44 Further amend the resolve by striking out all of section 9
46 and inserting in its place the following:

48 'Sec. 9. Allocation. Resolved: That the following funds are
allocated from Other Special Revenue funds to carry out the
50 purposes of this resolve.

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Further amend the resolve by renumbering the sections to read consecutively.

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Further amend the resolve by inserting before the statement of fact the following:

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This resolve establishes the Commission to Study the Need for a Technical College in York County. An allocation of Other Special Revenue funds is required by the Legislature in the amount of \$500 in fiscal year 1991-92 for printing and other miscellaneous commission expenses. Authorization is given to seek outside revenue sources. If no outside funding is available, the commission may not incur expenditures. In particular, General Fund expenditures are prohibited.'

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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This amendment changes the composition of the Commission to Study the Need for a Technical College in York County by reducing the number of Senators from 2 to one and by reducing the number of members from the House of Representatives from 2 to one. It stipulates that 2 tradespeople will be appointed to the commission, one from nominations submitted by the Maine Tradeswomen's Network and one from nominations submitted by the Maine American Federation of Labor - Congress of Industrial Organizations.

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COMMITTEE AMENDMENT

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1105, L.D. 1604

2 The amendment adds a duty requiring the commission to assess
4 the needs of people who have been traditionally underserved,
6 including women, minorities and persons with disabilities. It
 adds York County as a possible commission meeting site and makes
 other minor changes to the commission's powers.

8 The amendment deletes the request for staff assistance,
10 reimbursement for commission members and the appropriation. It
12 adds a provision prohibiting expenditures from the General Fund
 and permits the Legislative Council to administer outside funds
 acquired for the conduct of the study.

14 The amendment also adds an allocation and a fiscal note to
 the resolve.
