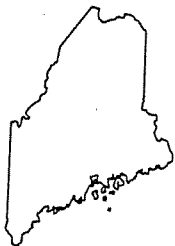

**An Act to Provide That An Upper Age Limit May Not Be Imposed By
the Maine State Housing Authority.**



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2
30-A MRSA §4802, sub-§2, as amended by PL 1989, c. 104, Pt.
4 C, §§8 and 10, is further amended to read:

6 2. Eligible mortgage loans. Eligible mortgage loans under
this subchapter are mortgage loans for the purpose of:

8 A. Acquiring one-family or multi-family housing units,
10 housing projects and improvements located on an Indian
reservation in the State;

12 B. Rehabilitating housing units or housing projects or to
14 promote the conservation of energy resources;

16 C. Constructing, reconstructing or developing housing units
or housing projects; and

18 D. Purchasing manufactured housing.

The Maine State Housing Authority may not impose an upper age
22 limit for persons eligible for eligible mortgage loans.

26 STATEMENT OF FACT

28 This bill provides that the Maine State Housing Authority
may not impose an upper age limit for persons eligible for loans
30 from the housing authority.
