An Act to Require Gender Impact Analysis as Part of All Audit and Program Reviews.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill requires all state agencies to include a gender impact analysis in their regular justification reports, which are filed as part of the "sunset" review conducted by the Joint Standing Committee on Audit and Program Review.
