COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1121, L.D. 1646, Bill, "An Act Regarding Cable Television"

Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the statement of fact and inserting in its place the following:

'30-A MRSA §3010, sub-§6-A is enacted to read:

6-A. Subscriber privacy. A cable television system operator may not intrude upon the privacy of a subscriber by installing or using any equipment that allows the system operator to observe or to listen to what is occurring in an individual subscriber's household without express, prior written consent of the subscriber.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment strikes the language of the bill. The amendment retains the substance of one provision of the bill that prohibits a cable television system operator from installing or using any equipment that allows the system operator to observe or to listen to what is occurring in an individual subscriber's household without express, prior written consent of the subscriber.
