IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE

RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of Maine to Reduce the Size of the Legislature.



Constitutional amendment. RESOLVED: Two thirds of each branch of the Legislature concurring, that the following amendment to the Constitution of Maine be proposed:

Constitution, Art. IV, Part First, §2, as amended by CR 1985, c. 3, is further amended to read:

Section 2. Number of Representatives; biennial division the State into districts for House ο£ Representatives. The House of Representatives shall consist of 10 151 members, except that, for the Legislature that convenes in 12 1997 and thereafter, the House of Representatives shall consist of 99 members, to be elected by the qualified electors, and hold their office 2 years from the day next preceding the first 14 Wednesday in December following the general election. Legislature which convenes in 1983 1995 and every 10th year 16 thereafter shall cause the State to be divided into districts for the choice of one Representative for each district. 18 The number Representatives shall be divided intothe number of 20 inhabitants of the State exclusive of foreigners not naturalized according to the latest Federal Decennial Census or a State 22 Census previously ordered by the Legislature to coincide with the Federal Decennial Census, to determine a mean population figure 24 for each Representative District. Each Representative District shall be formed of contiquous and compact territory and shall cross political subdivision lines the least number of times 26 necessary to establish as nearly as practicable equally populated 28 districts. Whenever the population of a municipality entitles it to more than one district, all whole districts shall be drawn 30 within municipal boundaries. Any population remainder within the municipality shall be included in a district with contiguous territory and shall be kept intact. 32

Constitution, Art. IV. Part Second, §1 is amended to read:

Section 1. Number of Senators. The Senate shall consist of an odd number of Senators, not less than 31 nor more than 35, except, for the Legislature that convenes in 1997 and thereafter, not less than 31 nor more than 33, elected at the same time and for the same term as Representatives by the qualified electors of the districts into which the State shall be from time to time divided.

; and be it further

Constitutional referendum procedure; form of question; effective date. Resolved: That the municipal officers of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding a statewide election, at a statewide election, on the Tuesday following the first Monday of November following the passage of this

resolution, to vote upon the ratification of the amendment proposed in this resolution by voting upon the following question:

"Shall the Constitution of Maine be amended as proposed by a resolution of the Legislature to reduce the size of the House of Representatives from 151 members to 99 members and limit the size of the Senate from no more than 35 members to no more than 33 members?"

The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question, and shall designate their choice by a cross or check mark placed within the corresponding square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots must be received, sorted, counted and declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall review the returns and, if it appears that a majority of the legal votes are cast in favor of the amendment, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay and the amendment becomes part of the Constitution on the date of the proclamation; and be it further

Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. Resolved: That the Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this resolution necessary to carry out the purposes of this referendum.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This resolution reduces the size of the House of Representatives from 151 members to 99 members and the size of the Senate from no more than 35 members to no more than 33 members. The redistricting will be done by the 117th Legislature and the reduction in the size of the bodies takes effect for the 118th Legislature.
