Resolve, to Study the Structure of Law Enforcement in the State.

(EMERGENCY)

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the study proposed by this resolve must be completed in time for a report to be submitted to the Second Regular Session of the 115th Legislature and therefore it is essential that this study be initiated as soon as possible; and

10 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 12 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 14 safety; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission to Study the Structure of Law Enforcement in the State is established; and be it further

Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of the following 8 members: three members of the House of Representatives to be appointed jointly by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives; 2
members of the Senate to be appointed jointly by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives; the Commissioner of Public Safety or the commissioner's designee; one sheriff appointed by the Governor; and one local law enforcement chief appointed by the Governor; and be it further

3. Appointments; meetings. **Resolved:** 30 Sec. That all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the 32 shall be Legislative Council notified by all appointing 34 authorities once the selections have been made. When the appointment of all members has been completed the Chair of the Legislative Council shall call and convene the first meeting of 36 the commission no later than July 15, 1991. The commission shall 38 select a chair from among its members; and be it further

40 Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall study the present structure of law enforcement throughout the State. The
 42 study must focus on ways to reduce the overlapping of law enforcement patrols to enable the maximization of law enforcement
 44 personnel. In examining this issue, the commission may:

 Conduct, tabulate and analyze the results of a survey of the public or affected persons and groups;

4. Procure and analyze relevant data;

5. Conduct legal research and prepare opinions on legal questions within the scope of the study; and

6. Determine and summarize the legislative actions or
 10 governmental programs undertaken in other jurisdictions related to the issue within the scope of the study; and be it further

Sec. 5. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the commission shall request staffing assistance from the Legislative Council; and be it further

Sec. 6. Reimbursement. Resolved: That the members of the commission who are Legislators are entitled to receive the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, for each day's attendance of commission hearings; and be it further

Sec. 7. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall submit its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation to the Second Regular Session of the 115th Legislature no later than November 1, 1991; and be it further

Sec. 8. Appropriation. Resolved: That the following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this resolve.
