	Before each use of a tanning device, the operator shall
8	provide the customer with properly sanitized protective eyewear
	that protects the eyes from ultraviolet radiation and allows
0	adequate vision to maintain balance. An operator may not allow a
	person to use a tanning device if that person does not use the
2	protective eyewear. The operator also shall show each customer
	how to use suitable physical aids, including but not limited to
4	handrails and markings on the floor, to maintain the proper
	exposure distance recommended by the manufacturer of the tanning

Before any minor between 14 and 18 years of age uses a tanning device, the minor shall give the operator a statement signed by the minor's parent or legal guardian stating that the parent or legal guardian consents to the minor's use of a tanning

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device.

	device. This statement may remain at the tanning facility for
2	future use by the minor. A minor under 14 years of age must be
	accompanied by a parent or legal quardian when using a tanning
4	device.
