Curriculum. Every person or school is required to submit a commercial driver education curriculum that is 34 appropriate to the type of license applied for by a student, as prescribed by the board. The Class A school curriculum must consist of at least 30 hours of actual classroom instruction and 36 6 hours of actual behind-the-wheel instruction before a student 38 may be issued a course completion certificate as required by Title 29, section 583. Classroom instruction must be limited to 40 not more than 4 hours in any 24-hour period. The Class B school curriculum must consist of at least 6 hours of behind-the-wheel 42 instruction. 4. A new or renewal license issued under section 9641 expires at such time as the commissioner establishes and is subject to section 9646.

§9646. Renewal; late fee

A person licensed under section 9641, on or before the annual expiration day, shall submit a renewal application and the prescribed renewal fee. A license may be renewed up to 90 days after the date of expiration upon payment of a late fee of \$10 in addition to the renewal fee. Any person who submits an application for renewal more than 90 days after the license renewal date is subject to all requirements governing new applicants under this chapter and the \$10 late fee. The board may waive the requirements for any person seeking renewal up to 2 years beyond the expiration date giving due consideration to the safety and protection of the public. The board may assess a penalty for a late renewal that is more than 90 days after a license expiration.

<u>§9647. Fees</u>

- 1. Examination fee. The board may establish an examination fee in an amount that is reasonable and necessary to prepare and administer the examination required in section 9643, subsection 1, paragraph H.
- 2. Commercial driver education school licensing fee. An application for a commercial driver education school license, as described in section 9641, subsection 1, must be accompanied by an application fee established by the board in an amount that is reasonable. The fee may not be refunded. On approval of the application and payment of a license fee, the board shall issue the applicant a commercial driver education school license. The board may establish by rule a fee for license renewal that may not exceed \$250 a year.
- 3. Commercial driver education instructor licensing fees.

 42 An application for a commercial driver education instructor's license, as described in section 9641, subsection 2, must be accompanied by an application fee established by the board in an amount that is reasonable. The fee may not be refunded. On approval of the application and payment of the license fee, the board shall issue the applicant a commercial driver education instructor's license. The board may establish by rule a fee for license renewal that may not exceed \$125 a year.

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All fees received by the board must be used to carry out the purposes of this chapter. Any balance of revenues from the collection of fees may not lapse but must be carried forward.

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§9649. Examination, investigation and inspection duties and expenses

- The holder of a commercial driver education school license or a commercial driver education instructor license may be assessed for the actual expenses incurred by the board or its agents for examination, special investigations or enforcement duties performed under this chapter.
- 16

 1. Inspections. Inspection duties include an on-site inspection of each commercial driver education school licensed under this chapter not less than every 3 years to review records, facilities and operating procedures. The cost of one on-site inspection is covered by the school's annual license fee. The fee of a subsequent inspection approved by the board must be paid by the commercial driver education school.
- 24 <u>2. Agents. The board may contract with the Department of the Secretary of State, Division of Motor Vehicles, to serve as an agent under this section.</u>
- 28 <u>3. Assessment and payment procedures.</u> The board may establish assessment and payment procedures by rule pursuant to 30 <u>Title 5, sections 8051 to 8059.</u>

§9650. Penalties; injunction

- A person operating a commercial driver education school or acting as a commercial driver education instructor without a license is guilty of a Class E crime.
- The State may bring an action in Superior Court to enjoin a person from violating this chapter, regardless of whether proceedings have been or may be instituted in the Administrative Court or whether criminal proceedings have been or may be instituted.

\$9651. Insurance for graduates

Rating bureaus or independent insurers recognized by the Superintendent of Insurance may grant an automobile insurance discount for commercial driver education school graduates on the same basis as for public school driver education graduates, if the graduate is certified by a commercial driver education school and the school is approved in accordance with this chapter.

24	This bill implements the changes required by the federal
	Commercial Motor Vehicle Safety Act of 1986. The bill also
26	allows the Board of Commercial Driver Education to establish new and revised qualification requirements for schools and
28	instructors that ensure compatibility with the new commercial
	driver's license laws as well as the standards adopted by the
30	Department of Education and the Maine Technical College System.
