IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE

Resolve, to Provide for the Study of Fraud and Overcompensation Involving Recipients of Aid to Families with Dependent Children and Food Stamps Assistance.

(EMERGENCY)

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Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

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Whereas, the study must be initiated before the 90-day period expires, in order that the study can be completed and a report submitted in time for submission to the next legislative session; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts 10 create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately 12 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 14 safety; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Committee established. Resolved: 16 That the Committee to Study the Potential for Fraud and Overcompensation Involving Recipients of Aid to Families with Dependent Children and Food 18 Stamps Assistance is established; and be it further

Sec. 2. Committee membership. Resolved: That the committee consists of the members of the Joint Standing Committee on Human Resources; and be it further

Sec. 3. First meeting; chair. Resolved: That the chair of the Legislative Council shall call and convene the first meeting of the committee within 2 weeks following the adjournment of the First Regular Session of the 115th Legislature. The committee shall select a chair from among its members; and be it further

Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the committee shall conduct a 32 study of the potential for fraud and overcompensation involving recipients of aid to families with dependent children and food 34 stamps assistance. In conducting the study the committee shall examine the following issues: 36

1. The extent of fraud and overcompensation in the food stamp assistance and aid to families with dependent children programs;

2. The factors, if any, responsible for fraud and 42 overcompensation in these programs;

3. The means by which fraud and overcompensation in these programs can be significantly reduced or eliminated, to include any structural, procedural and policy changes necessary to 46 achieve this goal;

Whether any other related programs of assistance to 4. low-income citizens should be investigated to determine the level of fraud and overcompensation in these programs; and

5. Whether an office similar to the federal Office of Inspector General would be a more effective and more efficient means to prevent fraud and overcompensation in State Government programs in comparison to the current structure, procedures and policies used to combat fraud and overcompensation in social service and welfare programs; and be it further

Sec. 5. Powers. Resolved: That in examining the issues in section 4 of this resolve, the committee may:

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1. Meet at convenient times and locations within Augusta;

14 2. Hold informational sessions for discussions with knowledgeable persons;

Conduct, summarize and analyze the results of a
literature search;

4. Conduct, tabulate and analyze the results of a survey of the public or affected persons and groups;

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5. Procure and analyze relevant data;

Conduct legal research and prepare opinions on legal
questions within the scope of the study; and

7. Determine and summarize the legislative actions or governmental programs undertaken in other jurisdictions related
to issues within the scope of the study; and be it further

32 Sec. 6. Assistance. Resolved: That the Department of Human Services, the Attorney General and other agencies of State 34 Government shall cooperate with the committee in providing information and assistance to the committee as expeditiously as 36 possible; and be it further

38 Sec. 7. Staff assistance. Resolved: That the committee may request staffing assistance from the Legislative Council; and be 40 it further

42 Sec. 8. Report. Resolved: That the committee shall submit its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation to
44 the Second Regular Session of the 115th Legislature no later than November 1, 1991; and be it further

Sec. 9. Appropriation. Resolved: That the following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this resolve.
