Resolve, to Establish a Commission to Study the Effects of Higher Utility Charges on Nonprofit Institutions.

(EMERGENCY)

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Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

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Whereas, nonprofit institutions of the State, including religious institutions, are currently paying the same rates, known as "demand charges," for electricity service as are paid by industrial and commercial users; and

Whereas, in hard economic times, it is increasingly difficult for nonprofit institutions to pay these necessary expenses; and

Whereas, this legislation creates a study commission to determine the impact of these charges on nonprofit institutions and to explore whether some ways might be found to reduce these charges; and

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Whereas, the study must be initiated before the 90-day period expires in order that the study may be completed and a report issued in time for submission to the next legislative session; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission to Study the Effects of Higher Utility Charges on Nonprofit Institutions is established; and be it further

Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of the following 10 members: one Senator who serves on the Joint Standing Committee on Utilities to be appointed by the President of the Senate; one member ο£ the House Representatives who serves on the Joint Standing Committee on Utilities to be appointed by the Speaker of the House Representatives; one representative of the Public Utilities Commission appointed by the Public Utilities Commission; the Director of the State Planning Office or the director's designee; the Director of Community Services or the director's designee; 3 representatives, each from a different electricity utility in the State, appointed by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives after consultation with the utilities; and 2 representatives of nonprofit organizations in the State, including religious organizations, appointed by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives; and be it further

Appointments; meetings. Resolved: all appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the 2 effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the 4 Legislative Council must be notified by all appointing authorities once the selections have been made. When the appointment of all members has been completed, the Chair of the б Legislative Council shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission no later than June 1, 1991. The commission shall select a chair from among its members; and be it further 10 Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall study the 12 effect of higher demand charges for electricity on nonprofit institutions, including religious institutions, of the State and 14 whether it is feasible for these charges to be reduced for those institutions. In examining this topic, the commission may: 16 Meet at such times and places as it determines 18 appropriate; 20 2. Hold informational sessions for discussions with knowledgeable persons; 22 Conduct, summarize and analyze the results 3. 24 literature search; Conduct, tabulate and analyze the results of a survey of 26 the public or affected persons and groups; 28 5. Procure and analyze relevant data; 30 Conduct legal research and prepare opinions on legal 32 questions within the scope of the study; and 34 Determine and summarize the legislative actions or governmental programs undertaken in other jurisdictions related to issues within the scope of the study; and be it further Sec. 5. Staff assistance. Resolved: 38 That the commission shall receive any necessary staff assistance from the Public Utilities Commission; and be it further 40 Sec. 6. Reimbursement. Resolved: That the members of the

Sec. 6. Reimbursement. Resolved: That the members of the commission who are Legislators are entitled to receive the legislative per diem, as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 3, section 2, for each day's attendance of commission hearings; and be it further

Sec. 7. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall submit its report, together with any necessary implementing legislation, to the Second Regular Session of the 115th Legislature no later than November 1, 1991; and be it further
