COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A " to S.P. 641, L.D. 1689, Bill, "An Act to Establish a Public Solid Waste Facilities Loan and Grant Program"

Amend the bill by inserting after section 4 the following:

Sec. 5. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A" to S.P. 641, L.D. 1689

2 This bill authorizes the Maine Municipal Bond Bank to
4 establish the Municipal Solid Waste Disposal Facilities Loan
6 Fund. General Fund appropriations or the issuance of general
8 obligation bonds will be required to capitalize this revolving
loan fund. L.D. 1277, which proposes a referendum to authorize
the issuance of \$10,000,000 in bonds for municipalities and
regional commissions is a companion bill to this bill and would
capitalize this fund.

12 The bill requires the Maine Waste Management Agency to
14 provide technical assistance to municipalities and regional
16 associations in addressing solid waste facility needs and to
develop a system to prioritize allocations of available
resources. A General Fund appropriation of \$121,568 in fiscal
18 year 1992-93 to the Maine Waste Management Agency is required for
the salary, fringe benefits and general operating expenses of an
20 Administrative Assistant position, an Engineering Technician IV
22 position and an Engineering Technician V position to perform
these duties. This General Fund appropriation may be reduced if
sufficient dedicated revenues are generated through the agency's
fee bill.'
