## STATEMENT OF FACT

For clarity, this amendment reallocates the language of the bill into its own new section.

This amendment clarifies that more than one telephone utility outreach program may be mandated by the Public Utilities Commission. Also, this amendment adds a new section requiring the commission to report back to the Joint Standing Committee on Utilities by January 15, 1992 on programs it has adopted or that it suggests for implementation of this provision.

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This amendment also adds a fiscal note.
