### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill prohibits the sale and distribution of milk products or meat products that may enter the human food chain produced by cows that have been administered the growth hormone bovine somatotropin, commonly known as BST.

The bill allows use of BST in research programs after one year from the effective date of approval of BST by the federal Food and Drug Administration and provides a mechanism by which the Commissioner of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources may approve the use of BST after one year from approval by the federal Food and Drug Administration and on the advice of the Commission on Biotechnology and Genetic Engineering.
