## STATEMENT OF FACT

14 The purpose of this bill is to upgrade the board rate for the State's foster children to the median child-rearing cost 16 calculated by the United States Department of Agriculture. Currently, the State's Level I board rate is 27% below the mean 18 calculated by the Federal Government.
