Resolve, to Establish the Commission to Study Service Delivery Systems for Children with Autism.

(EMERGENCY)



Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the study must be initiated before the 90-day

Whereas, the study must be initiated before the 90-day period expires, in order that the study may be completed and a report submitted in time for submission to the next legislative session; and

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Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

- Sec. 1. Commission established. Resolved: That the Commission to Study Service Delivery Systems for Children with Autism is established; and be it further
- Sec. 2. Commission membership. Resolved: That the commission consists of the following 7 members: two members of the Legislature appointed jointly by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives; 2 persons representing parents of children with autism appointed by the Governor; and 3 professionals having expertise in the field of autism appointed by the Governor; and be it further
 - 3. Appointments: meetings. Resolved: all That appointments must be made no later than 30 days following the effective date of this resolve. The Executive Director of the Legislative Council must be notified bv all appointing authorities once the selections have been made. When the appointment of all members has been completed the Chair of the Legislative Council shall call and convene the first meeting of the commission no later than July 15, 1991. The commission shall select a chair from among its members; and be it further
- Sec. 4. Duties. Resolved: That the commission shall study service delivery systems for children with autism. In conducting the study the commission shall evaluate the current service delivery system in the State and make recommendations to enhance the delivery of services as determined appropriate during the course of the commission's study.

In conducting the study, the commission may:

- Meet 3 times at convenient times and locations within Augusta;
 - Hold informational sessions for discussions with knowledgeable persons;

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	Sec. 7. Report. Resolved: That the commission shall submit
