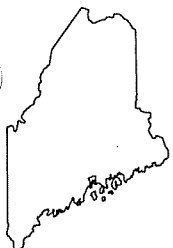

**Resolve, Directing the Department of Education and the Bureau of Insurance to Develop a Proposal to Allow Schools in Maine to Self-insure for Property, Fire and Theft.**

(AFTER DEADLINE)



2           **Sec. 1. Department of Education and Bureau of Insurance directed to**  
3 **develop proposal to allow schools in the State to self-insure. Resolved:**  
4           That the Department of Education and the Bureau of Insurance  
5 shall develop a proposal to allow elementary and secondary  
6 schools in the State to self-insure for property, fire and  
7 theft. The proposal must provide for the establishment of a  
8 reserve fund to indemnify the State for losses arising from  
9 self-insurance; and be it further

10           **Sec. 2. Submission date established. Resolved:** That the  
11 Department of Education and the Bureau of Insurance shall submit  
12 the proposal together with the necessary implementing legislation  
13 to the Joint Standing Committee on Education no later than  
14 November 1, 1992.
