result of recipients of those programs becoming qualified to receive federal disability benefits and no longer eligible to receive General Assistance or Aid to Families with Dependent Children benefits. Additional General Fund appropriations will be necessary for any increase in the number of individuals found eligible for these programs once the identified savings are utilized to reimburse Pine Tree Legal Assistance, Inc. and Legal Services for the Elderly, Inc. for legal work.

The costs associated with reporting to the Legislature will be absorbed within the budgeted resources of the Department of Human Services.'

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## STATEMENT OF FACT

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The amendment replaces the original bill. The Department of Human Services is authorized to use a limited amount of General Assistance and Aid to Families with Dependent Children funds for legal services to assist recipients of those programs to become qualified to receive federal disability benefits, thereby reducing the number of people receiving General Assistance or Aid to Families with Dependent Children. The amendment also adds a fiscal note to the bill.
