IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE

Resolve, Providing for a Study to Determine Whether In-state Training Should Be Offered to Persons Involved in the Handling and Disposition of Hazardous Wastes.

(EMERGENCY)

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Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the study must be initiated before the 90-day period expires, in order that the study can be completed and a report submitted in time for submission to the next legislative session; and

10 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 12 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 14 safety; now, therefore, be it

16 Sec. 1. Study by joint standing committee. Resolved: That the Joint Standing Committee on Energy and Natural Resources or a 18 subcommittee of the Joint Standing Committee on Energy and Natural Resources shall conduct a study to determine the training 20 needs necessary for people who are involved in the handling and disposition of hazardous wastes. Specifically, the study 22 includes:

- 24 1. A review of the training programs now available to people of the State in the handling and dispositions of hazardous 26 wastes;
- 28 2. An analysis of training requirements that are not currently available in the State;

An analysis of the types of responses to emergencies
 involving hazardous wastes for which people of the State need training;

4. The kinds of hazardous materials for which training inhandling and disposition is required;

38 5. An analysis of the number of people in this State requiring training in the handling and disposition of hazardous
 40 materials and the levels of training required;

6. An analysis of the expertise available in the State with respect to the handling and disposition of hazardous wastes;

- 7. The most feasible alternative for providing necessary
 46 training in the hazardous waste industry. These alternatives
 must be based on an analysis of training facilities and resources
 48 available in the private sector, the public sector and outside the State;
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8. An analysis of the costs of these alternatives; and

The committee's recommendation with respect to providing 9. 2 training to people of the State involved in the handling and disposition of hazardous wastes; and be it further 4 Sec. 2. Powers. Resolved: That in conducting this study, the committee may: 6 1. Meet at convenient times and locations within Augusta; 8 Hold informational 10 2. sessions for discussions with knowledgeable persons; 12 3. summarize and analyze the Conduct, results of a 14 literature search: 4. Conduct, tabulate and analyze the results of a survey of 16 the public or affected persons and groups; 18 5. Procure and analyze relevant data; 20 6. Conduct legal research and prepare opinions on legal 22 questions within the scope of the study; 24 7. Determine and summarize the legislative actions or governmental programs undertaken in other jurisdictions related to issues within the scope of the study; and be it further 26 Sec. 3. Staff assistance. Resolved: 28 That the committee shall request staffing assistance from the Legislative Council; and be 30 it further Sec. 4. Reimbursement. Resolved: 32 That the members of the committee who are Legislators are entitled to receive the legislative per diem as defined in the Maine Revised Statutes, 34 Title 3, section 2, for each day's attendance of committee 36 hearings; and be it further Sec. 5. Report. Resolved: That the committee shall submit its 38 report, together with any necessary implementing legislation dealing with the training needs of people involved in the 40 handling and disposition of hazardous wastes to the Second Regular Session of the 115th Legislature no later than November 42 1, 1991; and be it further 44 Sec. 6. Appropriation. Resolved: That the following funds are 46 appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this resolve.
