An Act to Modify the Language Governing the Special Commission on Governmental Restructuring.

(AFTER DEADLINE)

(EMERGENCY)



Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted 2 as emergencies; and Whereas, the language creating the Special Commission on Governmental Restructuring, as established in the Maine Revised б Statutes, Title 5, section 12004-J, may be ambiguous; and 8 Whereas, the reporting deadline for the Special Commission 10 on Governmental Restructuring may not be possible to meet; and Whereas. Commission 12 the Special Governmental Restructuring is called to make recommendations to the First Regular Session of the 115th Legislature; and 14 Whereas, there is a need for immediate action to assess the 16 nature and scope of government and to develop recommendations to address the current fiscal shortfall; and 18 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts 20 create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately 22 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 24 safety; now, therefore, Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 26 28 Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §12004-J, sub-§9, as enacted by PL 1991, c. 9, Pt. S, §1, is repealed. 30 Sec. 2. 5 MRSA c. 405, as enacted by PL 1991, c. 9, Pt. S, §2, 32 is repealed. Sec. 3. PL 1991, c. 9, Pt. S, §§3 to 5 are repealed. Special Commission on Governmental Restructuring 36 The Special Commission on Governmental Restructuring is established as an independent commission that shall advise, 38 consult and assist the executive and legislative branches of State Government with designing a plan for the restructuring of 40 The commission shall develop and present to the government. Governor and the Legislature by December 15, 1991 a final plan to 42 maximize citizen participation in public policy making, to use public resources more effectively and to consolidate and 44 restructure State Government in such a way that efficiency is assured and cost savings result. 46 It is the intent of the Legislature that the plan include a proposal to obtain this objective by consolidating, restructuring 50 and streamlining existing advisory groups that provide advice and

input to government. It is also the intent of the Legislature

that the plan include a special focus on those programs and services of government related to the provision of human services.

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- 1. The commission consists of no more than 22 members. The Governor shall appoint 10 members. The President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall jointly appoint 10 members. The Governor, the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representative shall together choose 2 additional members to serve as cochairs of the commission. No member of the commission may be an official, employee, consultant or any other individual employed or retained by the executive branch or a current member of the Legislature. Members must be appointed within 48 hours of the effective date of this Act.
 - 2. The following resources are available to the commission.
 - A. Any balances of funds appropriated to the commission remaining at the end of a fiscal year do not lapse but are carried forward from year to year to be expended for the same purposes.
 - B. In addition to funds appropriated for the purposes of this Act and funds otherwise available, the State Planning Office and the Office of the Executive Director of the Legislative Council shall, to the extent possible, jointly provide staff and administrative assistance to support the activities of the commission. The State Planning Office shall provide this assistance within its existing budgeted resources.
- It is the intent of the Legislature to consolidate, and realign functions of the departments of restructure government, including, but not limited to, the Department of Human Services, including the Office of Alcohol and Drug Abuse Department of Prevention; the Mental Health and Retardation; the Executive Department, Office of Substance Abuse; the Department of Education; the Department of Labor and the Executive Department, Division of Community Services. the further the intent οf Legislature to streamline administration and services through functional integration of similar operations. It is further the intent of the Legislature to create unified and functionally integrated operating agencies to coordinate and consolidate the effective delivery of services to those populations.
- 4. In conducting their study, the commission shall review all other studies that have been conducted in the past 5 years that have examined the restructuring or reorganization of State Government.

	5. The Special Commission on Governmental Restructuring
2	shall submit interim reports by June 1, 1991 and September 15, 1991 and a final report by December 15, 1991. The commission's
4	reports and final plan for the restructuring of government must be submitted to the Joint Standing Committee on State and Local
