An Act to Establish a Trauma Advisory Committee and a Voluntary Trauma Reporting System.

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	<u>§1421. Duty of physicians and hospitals</u>
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	All hospitals may voluntarily report to the Emergency
20	<u>Medical Services' Board all persons diagnosed as suffering from</u>
	<u>trauma. Trauma reports should be made no later than 30 days from</u>
22	the date of diagnosis or the date of discharge from the hospital,
	whichever is later. Trauma is defined by guidelines published by

The committee consists of at least 5 members appointed by the Emergency Medical Services' Board. Members are not entitled to compensation for their services. Members are appointed to 2-year terms, except that 2 of the initial members are appointed to 3-year terms.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill establishes a Trauma Prevention and Control Advisory Committee and authorizes the Emergency Medical Services' Board to establish, maintain and operate a statewide trauma-incidence registry.

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
