- 6. The Associate Commissioner of the Bureau of Adult and Secondary Vocational Education, Department of Education, or a designee;
- 7. One representative from a secondary vocational center or region and one representative from the Maine Council on Vocational Education, appointed jointly by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives;

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This amendment changes the membership of the Commission to Study Secondary Vocational and Technical Education in Maine, redefines the commission's duties, establishes a new reporting date of February 15, 1992 and adds a fiscal note to the resolve.
