Notwithstanding section 13119-A, information otherwise 4 confidential under that section may be disclosed: 6 1. Financing institutions or credit reporting services. To a financing institution or credit reporting service; R Transfer of securities or bonds. To the extent 10 2. necessary to the sale or transfer of revenue obligation 12 securities or of general obligation bonds; 3. Collection of certain obligations. If necessary to 14 assure collection of any obligation in which the department or municipality has or may have an interest; 16 18 Litigation or proceeding. In any litigation or 4. proceeding in which the department or the municipality appears, 20 for the purposes of introduction of the information into the record; 22 5. Order by lawful authority. Pursuant to a subpoena, request for production of documents, warrant or other order by 24 competent authority, as long as any such order appears to have first been served on the person to whom the confidential 26 information sought pertains or belongs and as long as any such 28 order appears on its face or otherwise to have been issued or made upon lawful authority; or 30 6. Authorization. Upon written authorization of release of 32 the confidential information by the person or persons to whom such information pertains. 34 STATEMENT OF FACT 36 The purpose of this bill is to balance the need for 38 accountability with the privacy rights of applicants for state or 40 local economic development assistance and to encourage submission of proposals that will benefit the municipality or the state. 42 Under current law, the Department of Economic and Community Development and municipalities may be required to disclose 44 personal financial information of applicants for state or local economic development assistance. This bill protects such 46 information, personal such tax returns or financial as statements, from public disclosure when submitted under a state

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or local program for housing, community or economic development.

Certain competitive business information is also protected.
