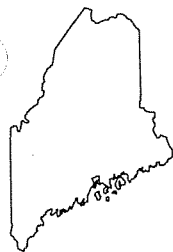

Resolve, to Authorize Oxford County to Issue Bonds for Improvements  
at the County Airport.

(AFTER DEADLINE)

(EMERGENCY)



Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts and resolves of the  
2 Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after  
adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

6       Whereas, improvements need to be made to the Oxford County  
airport; and

8       Whereas, the improvements need to be made as soon as  
possible so that the airport will remain a viable center of  
10 commerce; and

12       Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts  
create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of  
14 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately  
necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and  
16 safety; now, therefore, be it

18       Sec. 1. Bonds. Resolved: That to provide funds for certain  
improvements to the Oxford County airport, the treasurer of  
20 Oxford County, with the approval of the county commissioners, may  
borrow upon the full faith and credit of the county such sums,  
22 not exceeding in the aggregate \$200,000, as may be necessary and  
may issue bonds, which must bear on their face the words "Oxford  
24 County Capital Improvement Bonds." Each authorized issue is  
payable in such annual installments, beginning not more than 2  
26 years from the date of issuance, as will extinguish each loan in  
not more than 20 years from its date. The bonds must be signed  
28 by the treasurer of the county and countersigned by the majority  
of the county commissioners. The county may sell the securities  
30 at public or private sale upon such terms and conditions as the  
county commissioners may deem proper, but at not less than par  
32 and accrued interest; and be it further

34       Sec. 2. Temporary notes. Resolved: That the county treasurer,  
with the approval of the county commissioners, may issue  
36 temporary notes of the county, payable not more than one year  
from their dates, in anticipation of the issue of serial bonds  
38 under this resolve and may renew the same, but the time within  
which such serial bonds are due and payable may not, by reason of  
40 such temporary notes, be extended beyond the term fixed by this  
resolve. Any notes issued in anticipation of the serial bonds  
42 are paid from the proceeds of the bonds; and be it further

44       Sec. 3. No referendum required. Resolved: That,  
notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30-A, sections  
46 122 and 934, this resolve becomes valid upon enactment without  
being submitted to the voters of Oxford County.

48       Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the  
50 preamble, this resolve takes effect when approved.

**STATEMENT OF FACT**

4           This resolve authorizes the Oxford County commissioners to  
6           issue bonds up to \$200,000 for improvements to the Oxford County  
          airport. Those improvements include construction of facilities  
          for repairing, maintaining and painting aircraft.
