An Act to Expand the Membership of the Animal Welfare Board.

Empley Recommend, by majority vote, to the commissioner personnel, subject to the civil service law, as mesessary to assist the board in enforcing this Part and in carrying out its duties and responsibilities pertaining to this The beard commissioner shall appoint these part-time humane agents who shall serve as agents of the board in the enforcement of this Part and as otherwise provided by law. - Sec. 4. Membership terms. Any member serving on the Animal Welfare Board on the effective date of this Act shall continue to serve until the expiration of the term for which that member was appointed.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill expands the membership of the Animal Welfare Board from 9 to 11 voting members and establishes representation on the board for interests associated with animal shelters licensed by the State. The bill also grandfathers current board members.

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
