Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

The purpose of this bill is to reflect the policy that the purposes of health professional licensing are to ensure that the practitioners are competent and that licensing statutes contain standards and restrictions that clearly bear on a professional's competence to practice.

Under current law, an optometrist is not permitted to practice in a retail store. The Federal Trade Commission has attempted to remove such restrictions, but was prohibited from doing so because this was determined to be within the authority of the states. This bill specifically permits optometrists the opportunity to practice in retail stores.

The bill also adds new consumer protections regarding the practice of optometry and prohibits the promotion of the sale of services or goods in a manner that exploits a person for the financial gain of the practitioner or of a 3rd party.

The bill also requires an optometrist to make available to persons using the optometrist's services copies of documents in the possession and control of the optometrist when the documents have been prepared for and purchased by the user of the services.
