COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "B" to H.P. 1309, L.D. 1891, Bill, "An Act Concerning Railroad Personnel"

Amend the bill by inserting after section 1 the following:

'Sec. 2. 10 MRSA §8001, sub-§34, as repealed and replaced by PL 1991, c. 548, Pt. B, §1, is repealed.

Sec. 3. 26 MRSA §681, sub-§9, as enacted by PL 1989, c. 832, §3, is repealed.'

Further amend the bill by inserting after section 3 the following:

'Sec. 4. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

Provides funds to refund all fees paid by individuals to the Board of Licensure of Railroad Personnel.'

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16 This bill requires the Department of Professional and
Financial Regulation to refund all amounts collected from
18 licensing and examination fees paid by individuals under the
Maine Revised Statutes, Title 32, chapter 60. Since the Board of
20 Licensure of Railroad Personnel does not have sufficient
resources to return these fees, a General Fund appropriation to
22 the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation of
\$34,600 in fiscal year 1992-93 is required.'

26 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

28 This amendment repeals cross-references in the Maine Revised
Statutes to the Board of Licensure of Railroad Personnel, which
30 is repealed in the bill. The amendment also adds an
appropriation section and a fiscal note.
