### STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-ONE

Resolve, Directing the Public Utilities Commission to Analyze the Minimization of Electric Rates as an Integral Factor in the State's Least Cost Energy Plan.



Sec. 1. Public Utilities Commission analysis. Resolved: That the
Public Utilities Commission shall undertake an analysis of the
advisability of placing greater emphasis on electric rate
minimization in the development of conservation and demand-side
management programs. The analysis must:

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- Describe current commission policy with regard to electric rate minimization;
- 2. Analyze Maine's electric rates to determine the impact of recent and expected rate increases on the competitiveness of the State's businesses and the welfare of Maine citizens in comparison to other New England States, Quebec and the Maritime Provinces of Canada;
- 16 minimization as opposed to one that emphasizes bill minimization;
- 4. Propose one or more mechanisms to place greater emphasis
  on electric rate minimization in the commission's
  cost-effectiveness analysis of conservation and demand-side
  management programs;
  - 5. Identify any alternative mechanisms that the commission determines are appropriate to address the issue of the cost of demand-side management programs to ratepayers who do not participate in such programs; and
    - 6. Propose legislation that the commission determines necessary to effectuate electric rate minimization; and be it further

Sec. 2. Consultation and cooperation with other agencies.

Resolved: That in conducting this analysis, the Public Utilities
Commission shall consult with the State Planning Office, the
Public Advocate, electric utilities and customers of electric utilities; and be it further

Sec. 3. Legislative intent. Resolved: That the Legislature intends that the commission's analysis should recognize that low electric rates are an important factor in maintaining the competitiveness of the State's businesses and the welfare of the State's citizens and should consider whether adequate attention is being placed on the goal of electric rate minimization in combination with cost, risk diversity of supply, available alternatives, conservation and demand management; and be it further

Sec. 4. Report. Resolved: That the Public Utilities Commission shall report its findings to the Joint Standing Committee on Utilities by January 20, 1992. A copy of that report must be submitted to the Office of the Executive Director of the Legislative Council. The commission shall also submit a plan that describes the manner in which the commission proposes

to implement the policy described in this resolve. The report must also be accompanied by any proposed legislation required to implement the plan.

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#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This resolve directs the Public Utilities Commission to work with the State Planning Office, the Public Advocate and the State's electric utilities and their customers to study and analyze electric rate minimization as an internal factor in least cost energy planning and to report to the Joint Standing Committee on Utilities by January 20, 1992. This report must identify any legislation required to effectuate electric rate minimization in least cost planning mechanisms.
