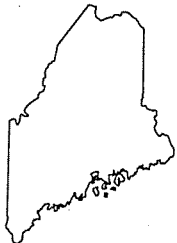

**An Act to Amend the Disability Laws Applicable to Members of the
Maine Judicial Retirement System.**

(AFTER DEADLINE)



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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4 MRSA §1353, sub-§4, ¶A, as enacted by PL 1983, c. 853, Pt. C, §§15 and 18, is amended to read:

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A. During the first 5-years 2 years, the allowance shall ~~continue~~ continues as long as the beneficiary ~~cannot~~ can not perform the duties of a judge.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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The purpose of this bill is to amend the judicial retirement laws to reduce the amount of time that must pass before the condition of a recipient of a disability retirement benefit is reviewed for continued payment of the benefit. This will treat judges the way other state employees are currently treated under retirement laws.
