STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment to the Errors Bill, L.D. 1954, amends the seat belt law to close a loophole in language approved in Public Law 1991, chapter 470. Public Law 1991, chapter 470 requires all passengers who are at least 4 years of age but under 19 years of age to be secured in a car seat or safety belt. There is no application to drivers under 19 years of age. This amendment makes the requirement apply to operators as well as passengers. This amendment also clarifies that the operator is responsible for making sure those under 19 years of age are secured by a safety belt or car seat. An operator who fails to do so commits a civil violation.

The effective date section makes this provision effective at the same time that nonemergency legislation takes effect.
