HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1375, L.D. 1960, Bill, "An Act to Fund Collective Bargaining Agreements and Benefits for Certain Employees Excluded from Collective Bargaining"

Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and before the emergency clause and inserting in its place the following:

PART A

Sec. A-1. Supplemental appropriation from the General Fund. There are appropriated from the General Fund for the fiscal years ending June 30, 1992 and June 30, 1993 the following sums.

29 given similar and equitable treatment on a pro rata basis to that
30 given employees covered by the collective bargaining agreements.

32 **Sec. A-4. Special account funding.** Funding provided by this
33 Part must be segregated into a special account to be made
34 available as needed upon the recommendation of the State Budget
35 Officer with the approval of the Governor. The funds must
36 include retirement costs. Positions supported from sources of
37 funding other than the General Fund and the Highway Fund must be
38 funded whenever possible from those other sources.

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Sec. B-2. New employees; similar and equitable treatment. Employees in classifications included in the bargaining units referred to in section 1 of this Part but who are excluded from collective bargaining pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 26, section 979-A, subsection 6, paragraphs E and F must be given similar and equitable treatment on a pro rata basis to that given employees covered by the collective bargaining agreements.

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Sec. B-3. Special account funding. Funding provided by this Part must be segregated into a special account to be made available as needed upon the recommendation of the State Budget Officer with the approval of the Governor. The funds must include retirement costs. Positions supported from sources of funding other than the General Fund must be funded whenever possible from those other sources.'

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Further amend the bill by inserting before the statement of fact the following:

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This bill provides funding for the 3rd year of the collective bargaining agreement between the State and the unions representing most of the State's classified employees. General Fund appropriations of \$16,147,500 and \$16,570,000 in fiscal years 1991-92 and 1992-93, respectively, are set aside in the salary plan account within the Department of Finance. Transfers

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2 will be made from these accounts as needed upon the
recommendation of the State Budget Officer with the approval of
the Governor.

4 Highway Fund allocations of \$5,735,200 in fiscal year
6 1991-92 and \$5,900,000 in fiscal year 1992-93 for the same
purpose are similarly set aside in the salary plan account for
8 the Highway Fund.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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14 This amendment changes the bill to fund the contracts
negotiated by the State and the Maine State Employees Association
and the American Federation of State, County and Municipal
16 Employees - Council #93 in a same manner as the contract
negotiated by the State and the Maine State Troopers Association
18 by eliminating the deappropriations and related language
contained in the original bill.
