Further amend the bill by inserting before the statement of fact the following:

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'FISCAL NOTE

10 This bill provides funding for the 3rd year of the collective bargaining agreement between the State and the unions representing most of the State's classified employees. General 12 Fund appropriations in Parts A and B of \$16,147,500 and 14 \$16,570,000 in fiscal years 1991-92 and 1992-93, respectively, are set aside in the salary plan account within the Department of 16 These appropriations are reduced deappropriations to be realized through savings measures 18 negotiated by the unions and the State. The net General Fund appropriations are reduced to zero in fiscal years 1991-92 and 20 1992-93.

Highway Fund allocations of \$5,735,200 in fiscal year 1991-92 and \$5,900,000 in fiscal year 1992-93 for the same purpose are similarly offset by equal deallocations and reduced to zero in those fiscal years.'

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STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment more accurately identifies the costs associated with the 3rd year of funding for each of the collective bargaining agreements and eliminates appropriations, which exceed the amount necessary to fund the contracts. The amendment provides for deappropriating and deallocating funds saved from attrition, unfilled vacancies, other reductions in the work force or other savings permitted by the collective bargaining agreements or as may be negotiated by the State and the state employee bargaining agents.
