SENATE AMENDMENT "B" to H.P. 1375, L.D. 1960, Bill, "An Act 14 to Fund Collective Bargaining Agreements and Benefits for Certain Employees Excluded from Collective Bargaining"

Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting 18 clause and before the emergency clause and inserting in its place the following:

Sec. D-1. Employees of the legislative branch. The Legislative Council may approve salary and benefit increases for employees within the legislative branch, including constitutional officers and the State Auditor, who are not subject to collective bargaining.'

Further amend the bill by inserting before the statement of 14 fact the following:

'FISCAL NOTE

This bill provides funding for the 3rd year of the 20 collective bargaining agreement between the State and the unions representing most of the State's classified employees and excluded from bargaining 22 employees units. General Fund appropriations in Parts A, B and C of \$17,599,500 and \$18,052,000 24 in fiscal years 1991-92 and 1992-93, respectively, are set aside in the salary plan account within the Department of Finance. These appropriations are reduced by equal deappropriations to be 26 realized through savings measures negotiated by the unions and 28 the State. The net General Fund appropriations are reduced to zero in fiscal years 1991-92 and 1992-93.

Highway Fund allocations of \$6,238,400 in fiscal year 1991-92 and \$6,468,000 in fiscal year 1992-93 for the same 32 purpose are similarly offset by equal deallocations and reduced 34 to zero in those fiscal years.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

amendment more accurately identifies the costs This associated with the 3rd year of funding for each of the 40 collective bargaining agreements and eliminates those appropriations that exceed the amount necessary to fund the 42 contracts. The amendment provides for deappropriating and deallocating funds saved from attrition, unfilled vacancies, 44 other temporary or permanent cost reductions in the work force or other savings permitted by the collective bargaining agreements 46 or as may be negotiated by the State and the state employees 48 bargaining agents.
