2 **Emergency preamble.** Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not
become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted
as emergencies; and

4 **Whereas,** the General Fund and Highway Fund budgets now in
6 force contain provisions that will repeal those budgets on July
11, 1991; and

8 **Whereas,** unless this legislation is immediately enacted, the
10 repeal of the current budgets will cause another cessation in the
operation of State Government; and

12 **Whereas,** another closure of State Government is not in the
14 interests of the peace, health and safety of the public; and

16 **Whereas,** in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts
create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of
18 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately
necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and
20 safety; now, therefore,

22 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

24 **Sec. 1.** PL 1991, c. 528, Pt. RRR is repealed.

26 **Sec. 2.** PL 1991, c. 529, Pt. E is repealed.

28 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the
preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

34 This bill repeals the provisions of Public Law 1991,
chapters 528 and 529 that repeal those laws effective at 12:01
36 a.m. on July 11, 1991. By repealing the repeal provisions, the
budgets enacted by those laws will remain in effect for fiscal
38 years 1991-92 and 1992-93.
