(EMERGENCY)



Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted 2 as emergencies; and 4 Whereas, the 90-day period may not terminate until after the beginning of the next fiscal year; and 6 8 Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incident to the operation of state departments and institutions will become due 10 and payable immediately; and 12 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately 14 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, 16 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 18 PART A 20 Appropriations and allocations.
