SENATE AMENDMENT "C " to H.P. 1393, L.D. 1979, Bill, "An Act Providing Unified Appropriations and Allocations for the Expenditures of State Government, General Fund and Other Funds, and Changing Certain Provisions of the Law Necessary to the Proper Operations of State Government for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1991, June 30, 1992 and June 30, 1993"


Amend the bill in Part SSS by striking out all of section SSS-7 and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. SSS-7. Calculation and transfer. Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1585, the State Budget Officer is authorized to calculate the payments, expenditures or encumbrances authorized by Resolve 1991, chapter 42; Private and Special Law 1991, chapters 42 and 43; and Public Law 1991, chapter 528 and to retroactively assign the liabilities for those payments, expenditures or encumbrances to the appropriate accounts based on the funding authorizations provided by this Act.

Sec. SSS-8. Legislative intent. It is the intent of the Legislature that the funding authorizations in Public Law 1991, chapter 528 are no longer authorized on the effective date of this Act.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment clarifies the applicability of funding authorization of the repealed budget act, Public Law 1991, chapter 528, to avoid potential unintended double counting.
