SENATE AMENDMENT "D" to H.P. 1393, L.D. 1979, Bill, "An Act Providing Unified Appropriations and Allocations for the Expenditures of State Government, General Fund and Other Funds, and Changing Certain Provisions of the Law Necessary to the Proper Operations of State Government for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1991, June 30, 1992 and June 30, 1993"

Amend the bill in Part III by striking out all of section III-1 and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. III-1. 5 MRSA §7-B is enacted to read:

§7-B. Use of state vehicles for commuting

No state-owned or state-leased vehicle may be used by any employee to commute between home and work, except for those vehicles authorized and assigned to a law enforcement official within the following organizational units: Bureau of State Police; Bureau of Capitol Security; Bureau of Intergovernmental Drug Enforcement; Office of the State Fire Marshal; Bureau of Liquor Enforcement; Bureau of Highway Safety; Division of Motor Vehicles; Bureau of Marine Patrol; Division of Probation and Parole and other correctional officers in the Department of Corrections; Bureau of Forestry; Division of Forest Fire Control; and Bureau of Parks and Recreation.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

The bill provides that no state-owned or state-leased vehicle may be used by any employee to commute between home and work. This amendment specifies that this restriction does not apply to vehicles authorized and assigned for specific law enforcement functions.
