An Act to Authorize Payment of Payroll Obligations to Certain State Employees for Work Already Performed for Which Payment Is Scheduled on July 16, 1991 and July 23, 1991.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted 2 as emergencies; and 4 Whereas, the 90-day period will not terminate before the expenditures of this Act are necessary; and б Whereas, certain obligations and expenses will become due 8 and payable on or immediately after July 16 and July 23, 1991; and 10 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 12 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately 14 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, 16 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 18 PART A 20 Sec. A-1. Authorization. Provides funds to make salary payments to Cycle B payroll employees for work performed and for workers' compensation expenses for which payment was scheduled to be made on July 23, 1991. Any funds not expended for this purpose lapse to their respective All Other funds.

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#### PART C

Sec. C-1. Payments under the Maine State Retirement System. The State Budget Officer is authorized to allot sufficient funds to the Maine State Retirement System to process and issue the payments required under the retirement plans of the Maine State Retirement System.

Sec. C-2. Essential employees; Maine State Retirement System. Those employees of the Maine State Retirement System that are necessary to make the payments authorized in section 1 of this Part are considered essential employees. The Executive Director of the Maine State Retirement System may employ those employees necessary to process and issue the payments required under the retirement plans of the Maine State Retirement System.

#### PART D

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Sec. D-1. Repeal. Parts A and B of this Act are repealed upon the effective date of a unified budget act for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1992 that has been enacted by the 115th Legislature and signed by the Governor.

Sec. D-2. Calculation and transfer. Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1585, the State Budget Officer
is authorized to calculate the payments authorized by Parts A and B of this Act and to retroactively assign the liabilities for
those payments to the appropriate accounts based on the funding authorizations provided in the unified budget act.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

#### FISCAL NOTE

This bill authorizes the payment of payroll obligations by providing temporary appropriations and allocations, which will be repealed on the effective date of a unified budget act. The State Budget Officer is authorized to transfer the liabilities created by these payments to the appropriate accounts.

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### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill authorizes the payment of Cycle A and Cycle B payroll checks to state employees who are scheduled to receive payment for work performed in fiscal year 1990-91 on July 16 and July 23, 1991, respectively.

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
