HOUSE AMENDMENT *ccc* to H.P. 1402, L.D. 1985, Bill, "An Act to Make Supplemental Appropriations and Allocations for the Expenditures of State Government for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1992 and June 30, 1993 and to Change Certain Provisions of Law"

Amend the bill by inserting at the end before the emergency clause the following:

**PART OO**

**Appropriation.** The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Part.

Positions - Legislative Count (1.0)  
Personal Services \$4,679

Provides funds for a Programmer Analyst position previously eliminated in Part A, section 9.

**Nutrition Program - Local Schools**

Personal Services (\$4,679)

Provides for the deappropriation of funds from salary savings.

16 This bill restores a position previously eliminated from the  
Department of Education in Part A by substituting an alternative  
18 deappropriation from the Department of Education. There is no  
net fiscal impact to the bill.

### STATEMENT OF FACT

24

26 This amendment restores one eliminated position in the  
Planning and Management Information Division of the Department of  
Education. This restored position is responsible for operating  
28 the department computers. The reduction in the deappropriation  
that results is \$4,679 and is matched by a new deappropriation by  
30 using temporary vacancy savings from another position in school  
nutrition. The effect of this amendment will retain the total  
32 deappropriation of the Department of Education in the revised  
fiscal year 1991-92 budget.
